

RESEURFACER SNOW TANKS

Many years ago, I had a gasoline tank in a boat which did not vent well. Running a full tank inevitably resulted in the vent line having a blockage of gasoline in it resulting in the tank sucking in on its aluminum seams as the engine ran. The seam soon opened up and the gas vapor smell made the boat unusable until the tank was repaired. A Sawzall and a toolbox full of gadgets extracted the tank. A fairly simple repair of welding an aluminum seam and repairing the vent line's tendency to trap gas seemed straightforward.

Almost all of my mechanics, friends and acquaintance had the same answer, "WE DON'T DO TANK REPAIRS!"...."BUY A NEW TANK"......"I'M NOT WELDING THAT."

So, a few thousand dollars, hours-and-hours of labor, and a new tank later, the boat was ready to run! Ran it for years, in fact, without smelling a gasoline vapor even once.

THE STORY

What's this have to do with ice rinks??? Well, we all have a resurfacer. While the poly water tanks in most are maintenance-free, the snow tanks are another story. Years of snow scrapings, hockey equipment, pucks and grease take their toll on the heartiest of paint jobs. A backup resurfacer, with its long periods of inactivity, has its own issues. It was recently time to repaint our ice.....the gray had taken over where the ice once had been pristine white. See the before and after pics....these photos were taken less than 12 hours apart.

In order to shave the ice down, which takes more time than the battery resurfacer can handle, we use our backup propane resurfacer. A new blade and full



Cold Weather and Broken Pipes!

With winter here, and freezing cold weather coming and going, making sure that the pipes in your building do not freeze is very important to the operation of the facility. With frozen or broken pipes comes a world of headaches for managers and staff. To be proactive, and to make sure this does



not happen to you or your staff, may take some extra time during a shift or before you or your staff close up for the night. However, in the end, you will be glad when you do not get that ever so feared phone call at 5:00am the next morning saying there is no water to fill the resurfacer or the bathrooms are a lake. Usually it just takes a short time to walk around the facility and check to make sure all pipes are insulated, and that refrigeration pipes or condensation drain lines that go thru exterior walls are all sealed so you do not get a draft. Checking all pass-through doors, as well as garage doors to the outside, to make sure all weather stripping is attached properly could save you some headaches. Not everything is 100% preventable, and in this business you never know what problem you may face next, but to take some steps to try and prevent it would be beneficial for you.

I recently had some pipes break in my facility, which reminded me the importance of making sure that all staff is aware of cold weather procedures well in advance of that weather setting in. It is also important to make sure you have the prop-

er tools and stock on hand to repair any problems that may occur. I did not have all the tools necessary and made quite a few trips to my local hardware store to get the supplies I needed to get the pipes fixed in a timely fashion. Of course after the third trip you would think that I had everything I needed but, nope, one more trip was needed to get the job done! After a couple hours at the rink, the repairs were made and we were back to normal operation. Luckily this was a weekday and I had some free hours in the morning to work on repairs before my next scheduled group arrived.

In my experience, to be pro-active rather than re-active is much more comforting. While we are in the middle of the busiest part of the season, and days off are far and few between, the last thing I want to do is get a phone call that something is wrong and have to drive into work. Especially when I could have prevented a problem by taking the time to inspect



propane tanks and the old machine was shaving nicely. Unfortunately, when it came time to dump the





shavings, they were stuck inside as if they were epoxied.

That snow defied gravity for quite awhile.....when it finally was persuaded out of the tank, the snow was full of rust and rust particles. See the pic!


What to do??

Thus, the tank renovation began in earnest! First the tank was grinded down with a 4" then 7" grind-



er, using ample ventilation and a vacuum to capture the particles generated. Spray primer was then used to help the paint adhere..see picture with the tank








As I run up against deadline for the Rink Rat, the project is not complete. A few spray coats of gloss white have been applied. I will follow up when the tank is complete.

UCONN Approves Plans For New 2,500-Seat Ice hockey Arena

The UConn Board of Trustees took a step toward the construction of a new ice hockey arena on campus Wednesday, approving plans for the facility.

The arena will seat 2,500 and be located adjacent to and connected to the Freitas Ice Forum. Hockey

East requires that schools have an arena to play in on campus.



The trustees authorized UConn

to "execute agreements necessary for any portion or all of the design, construction, financing, and operation of a new ice hockey arena on the Storrs campus, provided that the arena meets the minimum requirements of the Hockey East Association."

The Trouble With Winter

The weather has been crazy this year and it looks like it is going to end the same way. Who knows what

2019 will bring. Just in case, I thought that snow and ice might be something to talk about.



It has been my experience that a surprising percentage of liability claims brought against rinks and venues are due to injuries suffered outside the building. How do you protect your business?

First, you have to decide if you are going to due your own snow and ice removal or contract it out. If you want to do it yourself, you need to keep a log of what you do and when. Plaintiff attorneys are going to know the exact weather conditions at the time their client fell. You will have to show that you were on the ball at the time. Security cameras can be a big help as well but only if you save the video. Just because you don't see any incident on the screen doesn't mean someone isn't going to allege otherwise. If you do see something, it is critical to retain and document it. This may surprise you but sometimes the claimant might have a different version of the event that you are witnessing.

If you are hiring a contractor, make sure you do a contract. You want to make sure that the contractor is keeping logs, too. You want to make sure

the contract holds you harmless and indemnifies you in the event that the contractor is negligent. Further, make sure that it requires the contractor to carry insurance that names you as an Additional Insured. Finally, require a Certificate of Insurance as verification.

Next, the roof. Snow is one thing, rain another. Both is trouble. There were a lot of problems with

snow loads just a couple years ago. You don't want to experience a collapse. Please get up there and be vigilant. One more thing, make sure that the area above your entrances and exits are clear and free of snow and ice! You don't need to be bombing your customers. They might sue you.

I don't know about you but when I throw a party at my home I do everything I can to make sure my guests have a good time. When I see them after my party I hope they say "what a nice party; I can't wait until the next one.

Of course you can not be in charge or attend to everything within your facility to make sure your facility is throwing a great party, your staff needs to be on board. If your staff sees it as a party they also will start to view your customers differently. Maybe your staff has never thrown a party or just don't understand that it is a large part of their job. I am sure many teenagers or even college kids have been to parties and enjoyed themselves while someone else did all the work to make sure they or/and others had a good time. Your staff needs to be trained how to throw a party. For that matter they probably have not done very much cleaning after a party, this they also need to learn.

You should make sure your staff is accountable for a good party by outlining for them how they should throw your facility parties so that guests have a good time.

Here are some ideas that will lead to a good party /event at your facility.



Everything You Wanted to Know About Curling but Were Afraid to Ask

I have been fascinated with curling since the 2018 Olympics and the USA's great win, and I believe many of you share my interest in this sport.

Recently, NEISMA hosted a curling workshop and demonstration at the Fall Conference held at Phillips Academy, Andover, MA. Dave Gyger from Plymouth State was very knowledgeable and is an onhands representative for Curling.

Although I could possible make this a 4 page article, here are the highlights of that workshop for those who missed the conference. I highly recommend taking a deeper look into this exciting sport.

IMPORTANT FACTS:

⇒ The seasons for local arena are typically March through May and then July through October





- ⇒ A set of 16 stones BRAND NEW will run between \$11000 and \$13000
- ⇒ A set of slightly used (and these are perfectly acceptable in ice rinks) will be more in the range of \$4000-\$8000
- ⇒ Other items required for the sport: Brooms, Hacks, Sliders, Stabilizers, Push Sticks, Pebbling Cans, Portable Scoreboards, Measuring Device. This is not a complete list, but gives the essentials.
- \Rightarrow There are MANY you-tube videos on Curling
- ⇒ Players need a new pair of shoes for curling (NOT the shoes worn entering the rink)
- ⇒ Keep the pebble heads clean
- ⇒ Bonspiels is the term for a Curling tournament

Now, as to starting a Curling Program at your venue (note that both Plymouth State and Phillips Academy have successful Curling Clubs at their rink).

- ⇒ Get in touch with a venue that has curling and ask for advice. As Dave explained, it is a great group of people more than willing to help the sport grow.
- ⇒ Host a "Learn to Curl" event at your rink



- ⇒ ADVERTISE in the local papers and on social media.
- \Rightarrow Begin with novice leagues.
- ⇒ Begin with lessons for your staff on painting the ice as well as making ice for and then after curling.

This is just a small portion of what we experienced at Phillips. I was amazed watching Dave walk backwards with a backpack and "pebbling" the ice. Many Thanks to Dave Gyger and Plymouth State for sharing their expertise in and passion for Curling.


